The goal of culturally competent healthcare services is to provide the highest quality of care to every patients, regardless of race, ethnicity, cultural background or literacy. Good communication skill are the







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

Committee for the Purpose of Control and Supervision of Experiments on Animals, statutory body formed by the Act of the Indian parliament under the prevention of cruelty to animals act, 1960. Role of CPCSEA is to monitor animal experiments through ethics committees set up in institutions (IAEC).

The goal of CPCSEA, goal is to promote the human care of animals used in research. To provide specifications that will enhance animal well being and quality of research. They have activities regarding approval of animal house facilities, permission of committee for conducting experiments. As well as discussed the CPCSEA guidelines for veterinary care, it includes care, quarantine, separation of animals. Also discussed regarding procurement of animals done from established commercial animal vendors. Use of transport containers of appropriate size and in Animal husbandry discussed regarding adequate ventilation, easy access to food and water and also regarding SOP's.








A report on seminar held on 17/2/2023 at The Oxford College of Pharmacy interacted regarding a set of principles for the conduct of human experimentations for the medical professionals developed by the world medical association. A total of 20 students had participated. The document consists of 12 segments, each describing specific principles. These segments are discussed below in detail along with the original statement.

Also discussed regarding basic principles of medical research, which states medical research involving human subjects must conform to generally accepted scientific principles, be based on a thorough knowledge of the scientific literature, other relevant sources of information, and on adequate laboratory and where appropriate animal experimentation. Also about medical care, on which talked about equitable distribution, community distribution, intersectoral distribution, appropriate technology.





OUTCOME

The workshop was organized for B. Pharm, Pharm D, and M. Pharm students and faculty of The Oxford College of Pharmacy.


- The objective of the webinar is to create new age technology solutions to make the research execution easy and accessible.






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The objective of the workshop was achieved. The overall session benefited the students and research scholars. This workshop would help the participants in future to carry out meaningful

IPR & REGULATORY GUIDELINES FOR HERBAL DRUGS

HELD ON 13/12/2022 at The Oxford College of Pharmacy, Bangalore

A seminar titled "IPR & REGULATORY GUIDELINES FOR HERBAL DRUGS" was conducted on 13/12/2022 at The Oxford College of Pharmacy, Bangalore. Mrs Jenisha, Organizing Secretary welcomed guests and participants to the seminar. The students and faculty members from other neighboring states as well as Karnataka took part. There were a total of 79 participants including Staff and Students.

The speaker Dr.Parthasarathy, Professor and HOD, Department of Pharmacy Practice, The Oxford College of Pharmacy, Bangalore greeted the participants and highlighted the present IPR and regulatory rules for herbal pharmaceuticals in India and developed nations, along with the progress achieved for Regulatory guidelines for Herbal drugs in India. The absence of a proper system in the protection of the intellectual property in traditional medicinal knowledge has been a barrier to the development of traditional medicine into a viable health system. In consequence, this has led to holders of traditional knowledge wary of disclosing the information or knowledge in their own countries.

Additionally, speaker mentioned that Herbal drugs are regulated under the act- Drug and Cosmetic Act (D and C) 1940 and Rules 1945 in India. In this, individual provisions have been framed for Ayurveda, Unani, Siddha medicine. Department of AYUSH is the regulatory authority and mandate that any manufacture or marketing of herbal drugs have to be done after obtaining manufacturing license, as applicable.


The licensing, formulation composition, manufacture, labeling, packing, quality, and export are controlled by The D & C Act. Further, Schedule "T" of the act highlights the good manufacturing practice (GMP) requirements to be followed for the manufacture of herbal medicines. The official pharmacopoeias and formularies are available for the quality standards of the medicines. Additionally, Speaker discussed about the Global Herbal Market and Regulatory Framework in depth and Standardization of phytopharmaceuticals—Regulatory Prospectives, Botanical Product: An Overview of Global Regulatory Requirement in the afternoon session. And finally Mrs. Jenisha delivered the vote of thanks and she thanked Dr. Padmaa M.Paarakh, Principal, The Oxford College of Pharmacy, Bangalore for giving her an opportunity to organize this seminar.

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A REPORT ON SEMINAR

INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS "NEEM"

HELD ON 13/01/2023 at The Oxford College of Pharmacy, Bangalore.

A seminar titled INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS -NEEM was conducted on 13/01/2023 at The Oxford College of Pharmacy, Bangalore. Mrs Umaprabha, Organizing Secretary welcomed guests and participants to the seminar. The students and faculty members from other neighboring states as well as Karnataka took part. There were a total of 97 participants including Staff and Students.

The speaker Mrs. Divya S Kumar, Assistant Professor, Faculty of Pharmaceutics, The Oxford College of Pharmacy, discussed in detail about various INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS –NEEM and provided a case study report on Neem. The seminar was initiated with introduction of Neem which is obtained from the biological source Azadirachta indica. The oil extracted from its seeds can be used to cure various diseases. Researchers have shown extensive scientific interest on Neem, resulting in large number of research publications, books and conferences at national and international levels. Since the 1980s, many neem related process and products have been patented in Japan, USA and European countries.

The patent for Neem was first filed by W.R. Grace and the Department of Agriculture, USA in European Patent Office. The said patent was deemed to be a method of controlling fungi on plants comprising of contacting the fungi with a Neem oil formulation. In response to this, a legal opposition was filed by India against the grant of the patent, lodged by the New Delhi-based Research Foundation for Science, Technology and Ecology (RFSTE), in cooperation with the International Federation of Organic Agriculture Movements (IFOAM) and Magda Aelvoet, former green Member of the European Parliament (MEP). The patent was revoked citing lack of novelty, inventive step.

After the neem patent controversy, the need to protect the traditional knowledge of India has gained importance. In context to this, India has taken an initiative through TKDL (Traditional Knowledge Digital Library), which helps the examiners of Patent Offices to search for any information regarding substance or practice while granting patents and they can dismiss the grant of patent, if the substance or practice is already there in the TKDL list as Indian traditional knowledge. The speaker further stated various controversial patents on neem which are filed.





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Hence, finally speaker concluded that safeguarding of the IPRs is essential because there is an desire of the inventor to have exclusive rights/monopoly over the advancements made in technology and at the same time to exclude others from exploiting the same for commercial benefits. The awareness of exclusive rights to the original inventor(s) and penalty/punishment to infringer of such rights are the basis for the creation of IPR related laws. In turn, safeguarding of such IPR related laws will ensure better returns on the efforts put forth by R&D sector.

And finally Mrs. Umaprabha delivered the vote of thanks and she thanked Dr. Padmaa M. Paarakh, Principal, The Oxford College of Pharmacy, Bangalore for giving her an opportunity to organize this seminar.





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

Mrs Joyce, Organizing Secretary welcomed guests and participants to the seminar. The students and faculty members from other neighboring states as well as Karnataka took part. There were a total of 90 participants including Staff and Students.

The Speaker Dr. A. Muthu Kumar, Assistant Professor, The Oxford College of Pharmacy, discussed in detail about various INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS & TRADITIONAL KNOWLEDGE for herbal drugs and measures to strengthen the professional values of IPR and traditional knowledge in India.

Intellectual property refers to the protection of mind creations that have both moral and financial worth. Intellectual property rights are the rights granted to individuals over their inventions: they often grant the inventor an exclusive right to use his or her creations for a set length of time. An effective and enforced IPR protection regime encourages scientific discovery by providing substantial incentives to authors and inventors to generate intellectual assets. Further, he added it is important to raise IPR awareness among teachers, and young intellectuals about the benefits of patenting their innovative and original ideas, inventions, and so on. Such awareness, in turn, would be critical for the market's promotion of innovation, research and technological breakthroughs.

Countries like India, Peru, Panama, Costa Rica, Philippines, and the United States have developed their model for the protection of their traditional knowledge. India, for example, in the year 2001, set up the Traditional Knowledge Digital Library (TKDL) which acts as a India's database on traditional medicine. By proper documentation of traditional medicine, India has made it easy for patent examiners to find relevant prior art while assessing a patent application.

And finally Mrs. Joyce delivered the vote of thanks and she thanked Dr. Padmaa M.Paarakh, Principal, The Oxford College of Pharmacy, Bangalore for giving her an opportunity to organize this seminar.





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
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




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

Intellectual property refers to works that are the result of unique intellectual or creative labour. It is a tangible or communicative consequence of literary, artistic, or scientific work, and it might take the form of intellectual, material, or cultural goods. The legal rights that exist in those creations are known as intellectual property rights (IPR). India has joined the global patent framework by joining TRIPS and, more recently, the Madrid Protocol, although knowledge and competency in the subject remain low in academic institutions. The amount of money spent on R&D in India each year is enormous, despite the fact that locals file just 20% of all filed patents.

The herbal medicine inventions for patent protection can be classified in four types viz., Formulation Patents on Herbal Medicine which involves new dosage form and technology to get best therapeutic benefits, Combination Patents on Herbal Medicine which includes new or alternative herbal drug and/or herbal drug preparations which can target the same indication, Process Patents on Herbal Medicine which includes new methods which can be patented in the field of herbal medicine, and lastly New Indication of Herbal Drug and Herbal Medicine where a known herbal drug has a new indication in preventing or treating specific diseases.




Respected Sir,
