


7.1.5 Green campus initiatives

From July 1, 2022, Karnataka banned single-use plastic items that have low utility but are frequently littered around, such as plastic straws, polyethylene bags etc. The aim of the ban is to curb plastic pollution, since single-use plastic harms terrestrial and aquatic ecosystems.

The Oxford College of Pharmacy took an initiative to ban Single-use plastics like bottles, bags, spoons, straws, and cups are outright prohibited, and employees and students are made aware of this restriction during inaugural day of college as well as through orientation program for the freshers. Notices are also posted around the facility. Steel glasses have been introduced in the canteen in place of plastic tea cups in an effort to reduce the usage of plastic. The faculty and students are instructed to avoid using plastic water bottles and instead utilize steel or copper bottles.

The Institution also took initiative to minimize the noise & air pollution in the campus by motivating the students as well as staff to use bicycle, electric scooter, whereas those commuting from far places to use public transport to reduce the entry of fuel powered vehicles inside the campus.
