

1. Nature and Extent of involvement of Faculty and students in academic affairs/improvements

The Philosophy Behind Faculty Student Involvement:







- d. Maximize the use of daylight in order to enhance the interior environment for learning while reducing the energy consumption that would require power generation for electrical lighting.
- e. 40% solar/ photovoltaic energy is used in the campus.
- f. Sewage treatment plant of 3000kld per day is installed for the process of removing contaminants from waste water. It includes physical, chemical and biological process to remove these contaminants and produce environmentally safer treated waste water.
- g. Monthly water test is conducted and reports are sent to Karnataka Pollution Control.
- h. Recycled Water are reused for flush pot and gardening at campus, no water is let into the drainage. BBMP and Karnataka State Pollution Control Board regularly visit and certify that our campus is a green and neat one.
- i. Rain Water collection pits are being provided for each water outlets with filters supplied by Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike (BBMP).
- i. Regular awareness programs for water management in the campus are conducted.
- k. The waste are collected by M/s. Nanjundeshwara Enterprises and brought to the common area in the ground for further segregation. The Collected waste is segregated into wet waste and dry recyclables.
- 1. Under the "School Bell" program the architecture students had visited various schools for helping with the painting of walls.
