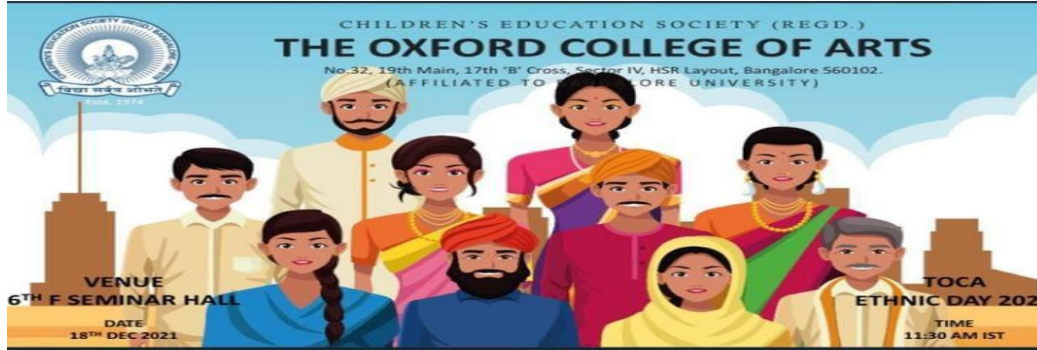
## "New Beginnings at the Oxford College of Arts"

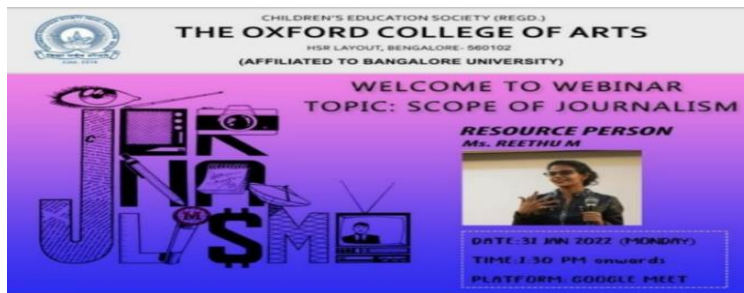
## NEP ORIENTATION PROGRAM FOR UG STUDENTS OF 2021-2022

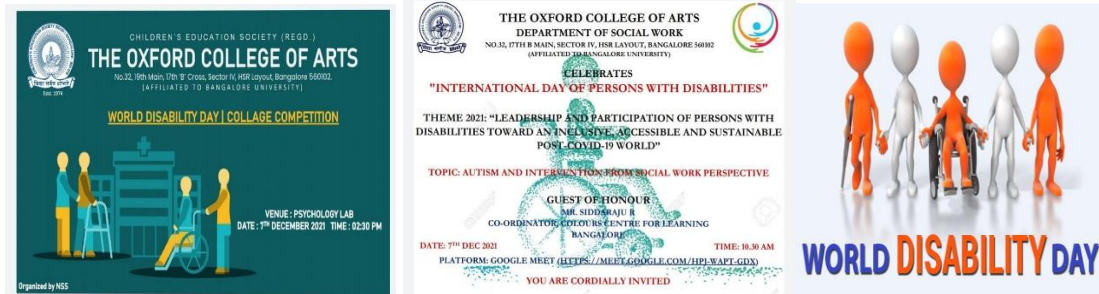
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# WORLD DISABILITY DAY

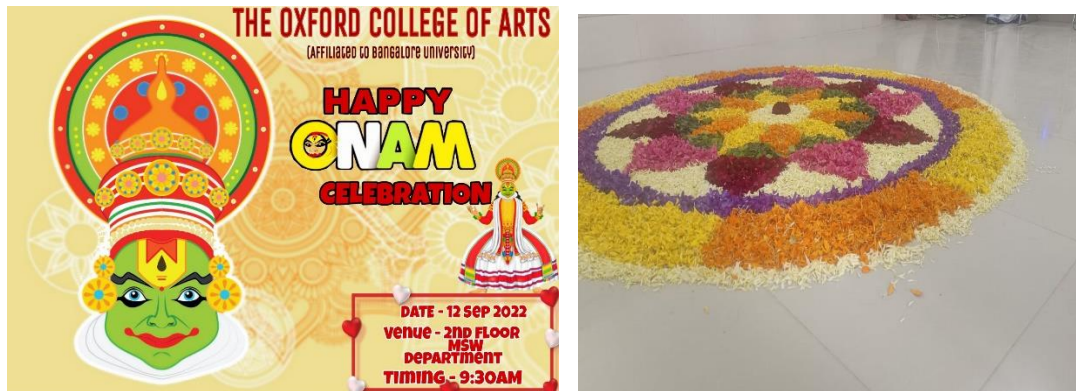
Leadership and participation of persons with disabilities
