
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Lakeview Life and its Irony & Seedball Making Activity

Inaugural Programme:

The Department of Social Work, The Oxford College of Arts organized an Inter University One Day Symposium on 'Trauma Informed Care' on 5th March 2025, at the HSR Campus. The session was inaugurated by Professor Naoki Nakamura, Associate Professor, Hokkaido University of Education, Hokkaido, Japan, Chief Guest of the program. The dignitaries gracing the dais were Dr. H B Bhuvaneshwari, Principal, Mrs. Gayathri Yuvraj, Dean – Humanities, The Oxford College of Arts, Dr. Kamatchi, Head, Research and Development, TOCSACM, Dr. Shashidhar Channappa, Head, Department of Social Work. 'VIKAASA', the E Magazine 2024 of Department of Social Work was released on this occasion, by the dignitaries.

About the Session:

Experiences that are emotionally painful and distressing, which overwhelm an individual's abilityto cope, and may affect mental, physical, social, emotional, and spiritual well-being (WHO).

Trauma-informed care is a strengths-based service delivery approach that emphasizes physical, psychological, and emotional safety for both providers and survivors, and creates opportunities for survivors to rebuild a sense of control and empowerment (Hopper, Bassuk and Olivet 2010).

The first Session was conducted by Prof. Naoki Nakamura, Associate Professor, Hokkaido University, Japan on Trauma Informed Care in Japan. He threw light on the factors determining various trauma and responses to it, in Japan. In the second session, Dr. Mutharaju Arelingaiah Psychiatric Social Work Professional Project Manager, Project SAMA Dept. of Psychiatric Social Work, NIMHANS, Bengaluru elaborated on Indian Perspectives of Trauma Informed Care. He provided insight on prevalence of various traumas in India, the socio cultural factors affecting it and trauma informed care interventions. Both the sessions were insightful and all the participants were much engaged in the session.

The psychology students from Krupanidhi Degree College, MSW students from PG centre Ramanagara and Department of Social Work Bangalore University, MSW Students from SEA College actively participated enthuciatically in the symposium.

Session:

In observance of world cancer day 2025, the Department of Social Work, The Oxford College of Arts, in association with Oxford Medical College and Research Centre, organized a session on Cancer Awareness for the students and faculty of the Oxford College of Arts, HSR Layout, Bangalore. Dr. Lalitha Hiremath and Dr. Vedavathi, from The Oxford Medical College and Research Centre conducted a useful and informative session on diagnosis, causes, treatment and prevention of cervical, breast and lung cancer.

It has been observed that Cancer happens to be one of the highest occurring life threatening non-communicable diseases in India. Early detection and timely treatment could restrict the morbidity and mortality of this disease. Life style factors are increasingly responsible for this disease, among all genetic and other factors. Hence the Awareness and Screening at this juncture was a conscious effort by the department to educate the students through them, reaching a larger community.

The participants were given a demonstration through a video on self-screening of breasts, in order identify the symptoms and arrest the same. They were also apprised of various preventive measures in day to day life.

50+ women were screened for the PAP test against cervical cancer along with a separate screening for breast cancer.

The whole event was conducted successfully, with active participation by students and faculty and including non-teaching staff, who utilized the session to be more aware of this alarming disease.
