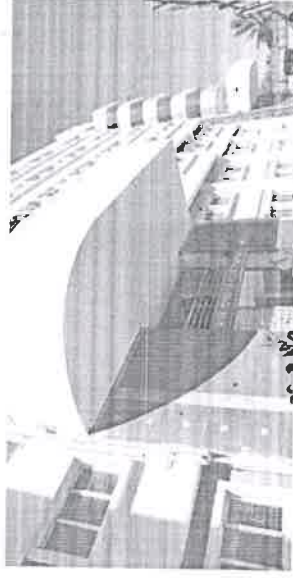

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PREAMBLE

The Department of Pharmacy Practice conducted the seminar on “Understanding Intellectual Property and Patents” for the students and teaching faculties. Dr. G. Parthasarathy, Professor and HOD, The Oxford College of Pharmacy, Bangalore delivered the lecture. There were 18 participants.

The content delivered in the seminar is as follows:

The speaker began the session addressing on the seminar topic- “**Understanding Intellectual Property and Patents**”. Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) includes inventions, literary and artistic works, designs, symbols, names, and images. These are basically legal rights. Protection of such ideas through IPR is very important to safeguard your intellectual assets and prevent others from using them without permission.

Some common forms of IPR includes patents, copyrights, trademarks, and trade secrets. One can go for registering the IPR, he or she can protect the ideas from infringement and ensure that you have the legal authority on your inventions. Additionally, IPR plays a vital role in nurturing innovation, creativity and economic development. IPR encourages inventors with incentive to invest time, effort and resources in developing new ideas and products so thereby which they can get the benefits of their inventions. It prevents unauthorised use, reproduction or distribution of the inventions by others. IPR promotes research and development by providing protection to new technologies, and advancements in research. Additionally, IPR enhances competitiveness of businesses by offering protection to brands, innovations, trade secrets thereby enabling differentiation between themselves in the market and maintaining competitive environment.

Later, the speaker addressing about patents- Patents are legal documents issued by the Government bodies to inventors with the intention to protect their inventions. The invention should be novel to be patentable under the Indian Patent Law. The Indian Patent System operates through administrative office called as the Controller of Patents. The objective of the patent law is to encourage new inventions, scientific research, new technology and industrial progress.



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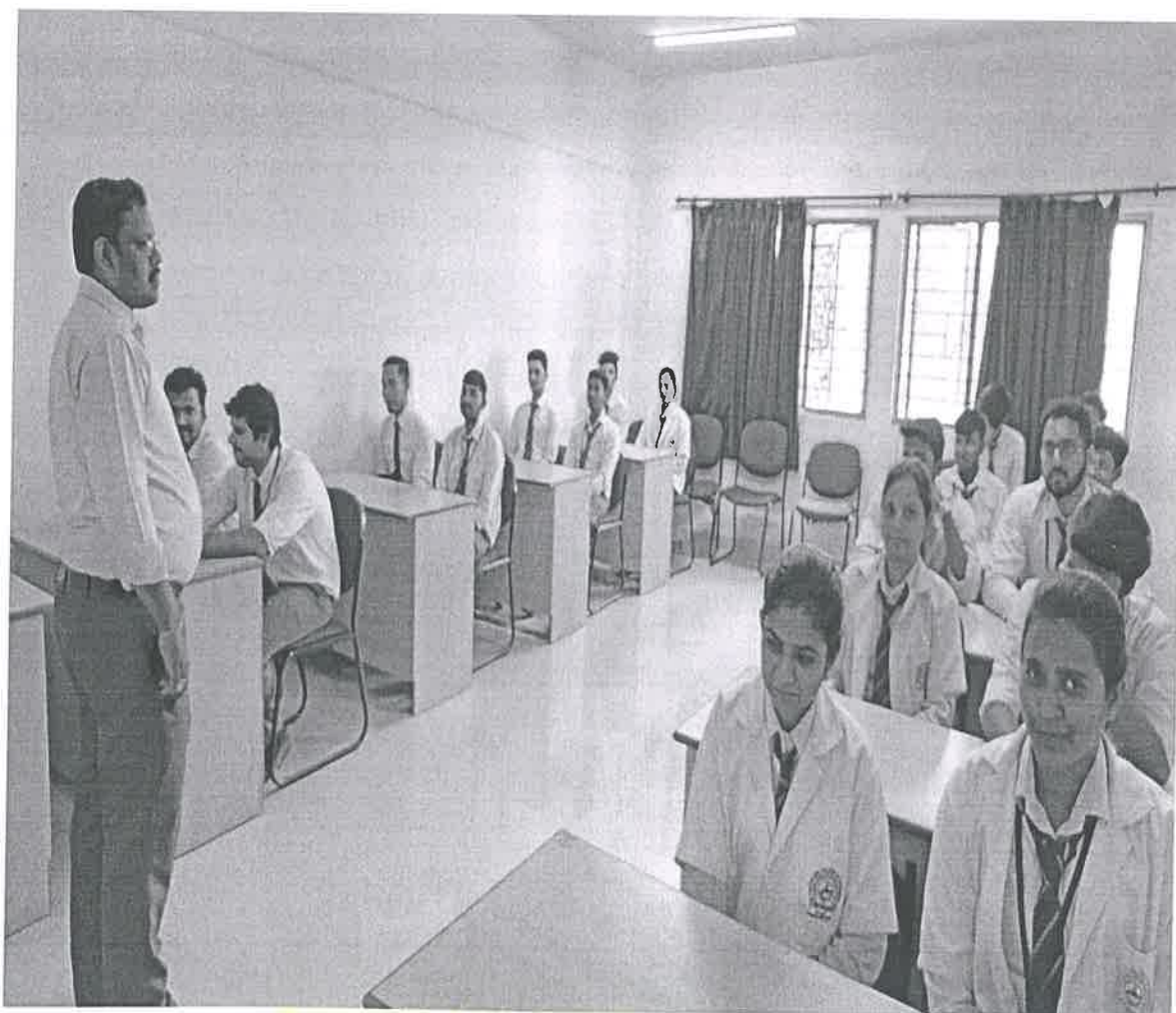
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The procedure for patent is as follows: Step 1- Idea or concept of invention, its field and its benefits. Step 2 consisting of drawing, diagram or a sketch which gives description about invention. Step 3 to check whether the invention is patentable or not in line with the Indian Patent Act. Step 4- to check whether invention meets all patent criteria as per the Indian Patent Act. Step 5- filing provisional patent application. Step 6 includes filing the complete specification of the patent, the application is published. Step 7 consists of scrutinization of the patent application where patent subject, the novelty, lack of clarity, invention steps are examined. Step 8 includes answering the queries raised by the patent office. Step 9 includes clearing all the objections raised regarding the invention. Step 10 verifies once again whether patent requirements are met, then the application will be placed for the grant.

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OUTCOME

There were 18 participants in the seminar. New ideas, inventions, creations, art work has to be protected and this is possible through IPR. IPR offers numerous benefits like it encourages innovation, provides protection of rights, fosters economic growth, preserves cultural heritage, enhances competitiveness and promotes research and development. Patent is also an intellectual property where the owner reserves the exclusive rights excluding others from making, using, selling an invention. After attending the seminar, the participants are able to understand about the protection of new ideas through IPR thereby offering a conducive environment for dissemination of the knowledge and ideas. Additionally, the steps involved in filing a patent were also briefed to the participants. The speaker also stressed on creating new inventions.
