Discipline in campus




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


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















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OUTCOME OF THE PROGRAM


THE AWARENESS PROGRAM DELIEVERED AS FOLLOWS:


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OUTCOME OF THE REPORT

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



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
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PREAMBLE:

The theme for 2022 was "To create a world where no women or girl is held back because they menstruate, by 2030"

CONTENT OF THE SESSION:

The speaker of the session was Dr Padmaa M Paarakh, Principal, The Oxford College of Pharmacy. The program started with the introduction of the program by the organizing secretary Ms Nagalakshmi R followed by awareness speech on importance of World Menstrual Hygiene Day by the speaker of the day. She also emphasised importance of well being of women for the overall development of society. 



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NATIONAL GIRL CHILD DAY











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
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SESSION ON

"ACHIEVING GENDER EQUALITY- WHAT WORKS AND WHAT DOESN'T WORKS"

A session on "Achieving Gender Equality in India: What Works, and What Doesn't Works" was conducted to strengthen the girl students. It was started at 10:00 AM. As it is COVID -19 period, the program was conducted in Microsoft teams 30 Girls students of B. Pharm, Pharm D attended the program. Dr N Lavanya enlightened students how to prevent discrimination against women's and girls. She spoke regarding India's progress toward gender equality and Crimes against women show an upward trend, in particular brutal crimes such as rapes, dowry deaths, and honour killings. These trends are disturbing as a natural prediction would be that with growth comes education and prosperity, and a possible decline in adherence to traditional institutions and socially prescribed gender roles that hold women back. She emphasized that Gender Equality is one of the severe issues in our current modern society. It refers to the equality of responsibilities, rights, and opportunities for females and males. Women, as well as girls, still fall behind the men and boys on the fundamental aspects globally. It is essential to maintain gender equality for global development as well. Till now, women are still incapable of contributing effectively, and in fact, they don't recognize their complete potential, she concluded the speech by saying that Educating Indian children from an early age about the importance of Gender Equality could be a meaningful start in that direction. After Dr Lavanya's session Ms. Kavya M, B. Pharm exhibited her views and mentioned about the increase in crimes against women. She spoke about the seriousness and frequency of violence and crime against women is well evident when the pages of daily newspapers are turned, when the television is viewed. Daily hundreds of cases of murder, rape, molestation, sexual abuse and eve-teasing, forcing women to prostitution etc., are reported by media. Even important T.V. channels have also started showing real cases of crime against women. She also spoken regarding the Crime against women has been on increase. It has existed in the past in almost all countries, regions, cultures and communities. The crime has much to do with the existing low status of women prevalent in our society. The violence is at various levels. It is at physical, mental. emotional, domestic and public. They are most oppressed, subjugated section of society. Though various measures at education,





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economic independence have been taken but they are far from improving their status which directly or indirectly help at increasing crime against women. She emphasized that attitude has to change drastically against women in order to ensure that no violence against them takes place. They have to be treated with equality and respect. The laws have to be implemented effectively and stringent action to be taken for violators or perpetrators of violence against women. Education of women is the foremost priority of today's parents. By educating women we help the families and not only women. Two strategies can be adopted. First, men have to change their attitudes so that women have enough space to develop themselves. Secondly, women themselves have to unite and spread consciousness which will help in real social development. Few other girls also spoke about parental preference for sons. They briefed about a culturally ingrained parental preferences for sons- emanating their importance as caregivers for parents in old age — is linked to poorer consequences for daughters. They spoke regarding the dowry system, involving a cash or in- the bride's family to the grooms at the time of marriage, is another institution that disempowers women.

Dr N Lavanya thanked all the students for participating in the program with a conclusion that there is a definite need to strengthen our legal and regulatory framework to fight the deeply-entrenched practice of gender inequality and we hope that the whole world will recognise the efforts of men and women in our modern society equally soon.



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

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
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SESSION ON EMPOWERING WOMEN


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




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INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY










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
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
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GUEST TALK ON MENTAL HEALTH OF WOMEN
